From Happy Valley Goose Bay Housing and Homelessness Coalition

The Happy Valley Goose Bay Housing and Homelessness Coalition has received funding from NICHI to construct 28 Seniors Units in Happy Valley-Goose Bay

The construction has started and projected to be completed October 31 2025. There will be four 6-plexes and one 4-plex built on a new street "Anderson Crescent" in the West Hefler Subdivision.

The application process and all information about the project will be released to the community in March 2025


New Call for 2025-2026
