

HIGHLIGHTING OUR REGIONS

Housing Stability Initiative Community Advisory Board

The Housing Stability Initiative (HSI) Community Advisory Board (CAB) covers Southwestern Newfoundland. The HSI was formed by various local organizations and service providers including, but not limited to, the



Community Education Network, BSG Women's Center, NL Aboriginal Women's Network, Stephenville Lions Club, Western Health - Mental Health and Addictions, RCMP. Zion Pentecostal Church and Lifewise.

Under the HSI board, smaller subcommittees were formed to compliment the full representation of the CAB.

Some initiatives of their staff and board are:

- 1. The Community Café: Through partnerships with local groups, this cafe offers free hot meals to community members on the second Thursday of each month. In addition to this, the dedicated committee members meet every two months to discuss upcoming plans and share updates. Since the community cafe started, many other organizations have joined in and began their own cafes. Now in Stephenville, there is a free cafe every Thursday of the month!
- 2. **The Landing: Supportive Housing for Youth:** With funding from the Reaching Homes Rural and Remote Stream, this facility opened it's doors in February 2024. The Landing offers 7 private bedsitting units to youth ages 18-30 and provides 24/7 staff to support youth and teach them skills needed for living independently. Youth can stay up to 2 years (subject to funding continuation) and have access to wrap around supports and services based on identified needs.

GOOD NEWS STORY

Central Receives Grant to Support Lunchtime Program.

The Central Housing and Homelessness Network (CHHN) and Violence Prevention South and Central (VPSC) identified a need in Grand Falls - Windsor and have been providing lunches to all five schools in the community over the past couple of years. This year, with the increasing demand and (at the time) no available funding, all schools were notified that the initiative was unable to continue into the 2024-2025 school year.

That was up until recently, when CHHN and VPSC received the wonderful news that they were granted a one-time amount of \$70,000 from the Department of Education. This money will help significantly in continuing with the much needed service and providing 65+ students with a lunchtime meal.

This initiative has and will continue to have a positive impact on the students' lives and the overall school environment.
