This past month we were beyond fortunate and grateful to attend two very impactful, rewarding and educational events.

The Purposeful Group hosted a group of individuals in Bonavista for the **big ideas. small places**. rural gathering where we talked about everything rural and remote Newfoundland and Labrador; how communities have rebuilt themselves, what drives their passions and how these communities stay sustainable during challenges. It was inspiring to see the wonderful, creative success the Bonavista Peninsula has managed to achieve, maintain AND attract! We'd be lying if we said we didn't LOVE all the food and sweets we got to enjoy, but the conversations and connections we made were so heart warming and inspiring.

This visit left us with the reassurance that with some creativity and the need for collaboration, there's nothing holding rural communities back from obtaining economic, housing, community goals!

Just last week we also got to attend the **Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness' 2025 National Conference on Ending Homelessness.** This was an incredible, eye opening experience where over 2300 people gathered in Montreal to learn about new technologies being used to addressing housing instability and homelessness, new funding and

partnership models, development ideas and tools that can be applied to make day to day coordinating and tasks easier.

We got to catch up with some local friends, re-connect with some presenters we hosted earlier this month in Gander, and meet some new faces we've been so excited to connect with!

Sherri attended sessions such as Artificial Intelligence in Homelessness Response, Leading Forward: Empowering the leaders of tomorrow to end homelessness today, Building Collaborative Leadership with Intention, Strengthening Renter Rights Across Canada: From Policy to Action, and Partners in progress: how elected officials and advocates can collaborate to create change.

Samantha was excited to learn about how AI was being used in organizations day to day operations and research, how other regions collaborate to have true coordinated access to services and how people in rural communities are working together to find solutions against stigma and other immediate community concerns.

We sat in on plenaries and inspiring keynote speeches from Canadian musician Steven Page, advocate and organizer Loretta Ross and PhD student with Lived Experience Jessie Thistle. Hearing their stories of real life resilience and overcoming challenges was emotional; they made us laugh, think and question what is within our power for change.

CMHA - NL is offering FREE trainings in the Central region for newcomers, folks working with newcomers, employers etc.


→ The Community Ideas Festival 2024 was a huge success — bringing people together from across Newfoundland & Labrador to learn, connect, and spark change.
