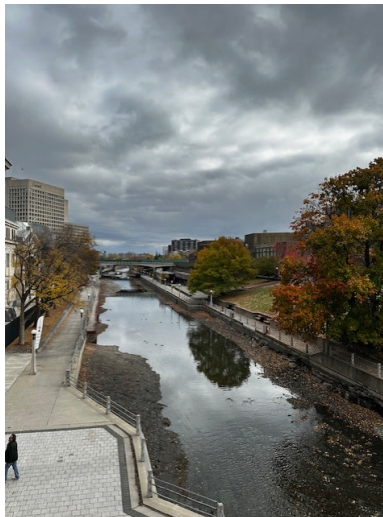

Community Coalition on Housing and Homelessness

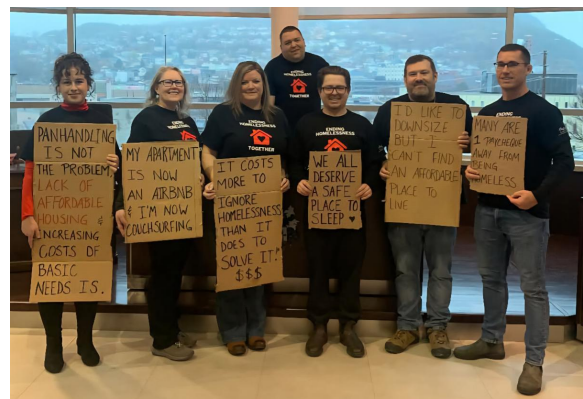
The Community Coalition on Housing & Homelessness (CCHH) participated in the recent Municipalities Newfoundland and Labrador Conference in Corner Brook on November 20th - 22nd.

At the MNL Trade Show, CCHH representatives had the opportunity to speak directly with mayors, councilors, and municipal staff from across the province about the work they do as frontline staff and how important it is for municipalities to work with other levels of government and concerned organizations, businesses and persons with lived experience to address the housing needs in rural and remote NL.



Members also participated in a panel discussion titled Housing, Community, and Well-Being – Working Together for Local Solutions. The session explored how housing stability, community support, and municipal leadership intersect. Panelists discussed practical approaches to advancing housing projects, strengthening local partnerships, and supporting resident well-being.

Finally, several members attended the intergovernmental Breakfast at the Corner Brook City Hall on National Housing Day to sign a National Housing Day Proclamation and to "shock" a lot of the folks that attended with the reality of many who are having difficulty making ends meet and are just barely surviving.



The CCHH would like to thank Municipalities NL for the opportunity to engage all municipal leaders and for their efforts to work collectively to address the current housing issues within our province.

"We just completed a three day clothing drive in this area. We had another successful event with all clothing, holiday decor and small appliances, furniture all donated by the community. Those who came through were so thankful for the event.

We have our Community Supper planned for January and anticipate there will be over 200 in attendance for that. "

Thank you for the support!"



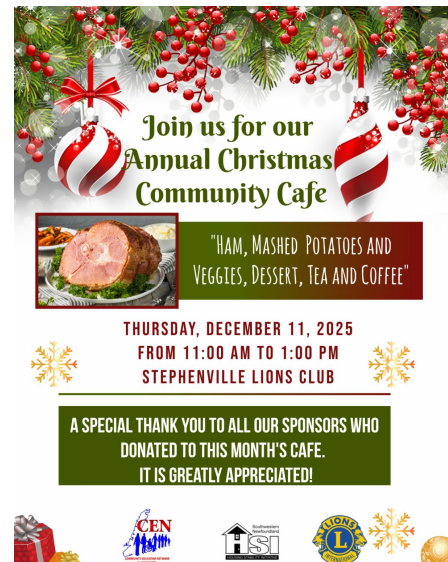
